ACT NO: 1-07

AN ACT

To organize the Executive Branch of the Government of the State of Chuuk pursuant to Section 10, Article VI of the Constitution of the State of Chuuk, to define the powers and duties of each Department and office, to provide for appointment of certain offficials with the advice and consent of the Senate, Chuuk State Legislature, to repeal Truk State Law No. 3-25 and all amendments thereto in their entireties, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CHUUK STATE LEGISLATURE:

1	S	ection 1.	Designation. This Act shall be known
2	and m	ay be cite	ed as the "Executive Branch Organization
3	Act o	f 1990."	
4	S	ection 2.	Executive Organization. In addition to
5	the C	office of	the Governor and Office of the Lieutenant
6	Gover	mor, the	Executive Branch of Chuuk State Government
7	shall	consist	of the following Departments and Offices:
8		1.	Department of Health Services;
9		2.	Department of Education;
10	a	3.	Department of Transportation;
11		4.	Department of Marine Resources;
12		5.	Department of Agriculture;
13		6.	Department of Public Affairs;
14		7.	Department of Treasury;
15		8.	Department of Justice;
16		9.	Department of Public Works;
17		10.	Department of Planning and Statistics;
18		= 11.	Department of Commerce and Industry;
19		12.	Office of Budget; and
20		13.	Office of Personnel.
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1	Section 3. Designation of Heads of Departments and		
2	Offices. The titles of the heads of Departments and Offices		
3	established by Section 2 of this Act shall be as follows:		
4	(1) Director of Health Services;		
5	(2) Director of Education;		
6	(3) Director of Transportation;		
7	(4) Director of Marine Resources;		
8	(5) Director of Agriculture;		
9	(6). Director of Public Affairs;		
10	(7) Director of Treasury;		
11	(8) Attorney General;		
12	(9) Director of Public Works;		
13	(10) Director of Planning and Statistics;		
14	(11) Director of Commerce and Industry;		
15	(12) Director of Budget; and		
16	(13) Director of Personnel.		
17	Section 4. Department of Health Services. The		
18	Department of Health Services consists of the divisions of		
19	Field Dispensary; Management and Administration; Public		
20	Health; Nursing; Dentistry; and Sanitation. This Department		
21	is responsible for vocational rehabilitation, rural		
22	sanitation, health education, and aging. It shall generally		
23	provide for the protection and promotion of the public		
24	health, and shall administer medical and dental		
25	facilities of the State.		
26	Section 5. Department of Education. The Department of		
27	Education shall be composed of the divisions of Elementary		
28	School; Secondary School; Curriculum; and Special Programs,		
29	and shall provide for, support and administer a State-wide		
30	system of public schools and instruction, PROVIDED, however,		
31	that the Department of Education shall continue in its		
32	present status until Sections 3 and 4 of Article X		
33	of the Constitution have been fully implemented.		
34	Total Control of the		

1	Section 6. Department of Transportation. The Department			
2	of Transportation consists of the Divisions of Sea and the			
3	Division of Air. This Department is responsible for			
4	interisland and international shipping operations, harbors			
5	and port regulations, facilities and activities, adherence			
6	to applicable safety regulations both local and			
7	international, search and rescue operations; and air			
8	transportation matters in Chuuk State. Until an Airport			
9	Authority is established by statute, the operations of State			
10	airports and airport facilities shall be the responsibility			
11	of this Department.			
12	Section 7. Department of Marine Resources. The			
13	Department of Marine Resources consists of the divisions of:			
14	a) Fisheries Research and Development;			
15	b) Conservation and Management; and			
16	c) Operation and Technical Support.			
17	This Departments is responsible for the conservation,			
18	promotion, development, marketability, economic viability and			
19	support of mariculture projects, fisheries, and commercial			
20	utilization of marine resources in the State.			
21	Section 8. Department of Agriculture. The			
22	Department of Agriculture consists of the a) Division of			
23	Plant Industry and Marketing, b) Division of Forestry and			
24	Soil Conservation, and c) Division of Livestock Industry.			
25	The Department of Agriculture shall be responsible for			
26	the conservation, development, and marketability of the			
27	State's agricultural resources and products.			
28	Section 9. Department of Public Affairs. This			
29	Department consists of the divisions of Governmental			
30	Relations, Public Information and Broadcast, and			
31	Youth. It is responsible for governmental affairs, effective			
32	communication and relationship, including protocol between			
33	the State and Municipal Governments, between the Municipal			
34	Governments, between the State and the National Government of			

1	the rederated States of Micronesia, between the State and
2	other governments, and shall be responsible for the
3	dissemination of public information and everything affecting
4	youth and shall facilitate communication between the State
5	Government, its agencies, instrumentalities and political
6	subdivisions, and other governments, their agencies and
7	instrumentalities, operate State owned broadcast facilities
8	and foster community and youth initiative and self-help.
9	Section 10. Department of Treasury. The Department
10	of Treasury consists of the divisions of Finance; Automated
11	Data Processing; Revenue; and, Property and Supply. This
12	Department shall provide for the administration and
13	management of government fiscal operation, revenues,
14	property and supplies, and shall coordinate all financial
15	grants and assistance. Each of these divisions shall be
16	headed by a Chief. This Department shall be primarily
17	responsible for the administration, management and accounting
18	of all distributions, procurement, and other transactions of
19	government finances, revenues, assets, and property pursuant
20	to law.
21	Section 11. Department of Justice
22	This Department consists of the co-equal divisions of
23	Law and Public Safety. The Attorney General is the head of
24	the Department who shall have overall authority and
25	supervision over the divisions. The Chief of
26	Police is the head of the Division of the Public Safety and
27	the Chief of Law who may be the Attorney General shall
28	head the Division of Law. The Division of Public Safety
29	shall promote and protect public safety and maintain public
30	peace and order, enforce all laws, conduct criminal
31	investigation, assist in the conduct of prosecution, serve
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       legal processes, operate and administer penal institutions,
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       provide rehabilitation programs for inmates, and provide fire
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       prevention and fire rescue. The Division of Law shall
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       provide legal services, including but not limited to legal
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       advice, opinions, contract preparation, review legislative,
       drafting and representation when appropriate of the State
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       Government, its agencies, instrumentalities, and political
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       subdivisions.
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           Section 12. Office of Budget. The Office of Budget shall
       be responsible for the coordination and execution of the
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       entire budget process of the State, which shall include
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       coordination and preparation of annual and long term budgets
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       of the State. This process includes also budget formation,
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       review of allottment issuance, forecasting and fiscal control.
           Section 13. Department of Public Works. The Department
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       of Public Works consists of the following divisions: Roads
       and Government Facilities; and, Public Utilities. This
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       Department is responsible for the maintenance of public roads
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       and government facilities, public utilities, and for the
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       review and approval of drawings or plans for proposed
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       government facilities. The Division of Public Utilities
       shall automatically cease to exist when the Public Utilities
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       Corporation is operational, upon notification to the Governor
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       and the Director of Public Works of such operational status
       by the Chairman of the Board of Directors, Public Utilities
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       Corporation.
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           Section 14. Department of Planning and Statistics.
       The Department of Planning and Statistics consists
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       of the divisions of Planning; Statistics; and Census.
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       This Department shall formulate development plans, review and
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       make recommendations on projects and programs of the State
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      Government, and when applicable, municipal programs and
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      projects, coordinate and implement financial grants and
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1	assistance to the State Government, compile statistical data
2	coordinate and mobilize all government resources and projects
3	and programs, monitor report on the implementation of
4	national, State and municipal development plans. This
5	Department shall coordinate with other departments, offices
6	and branches of the State and National Governments to the
7	maximum extent in order to facilitate planning and
8	implementation of projects and programs.
9	Section 15. Department of Commerce and Industry. The
10	Department of Commerce and Industry consists of the divisions
11	of Labor and Manpower; Business and Trade; and, Land
12	Management and Historic Preservation. This Department is
13	responsible for the commercial and industrial development of
14	the State, municipal economic programs, including the
15	authority to negotiate government leases, acquire, manage,
16	survey, and register public lands and shall be responsible
17	for the custody of public land documents, and the
18	identification, registration, and maintenance of historical
19	sites, monuments, and land marks.
20	Section 16. Office of Personnel. The Office of
21	Personnel shall administer the Public Service System of the
22	State until the Public Service Commission becomes operational
23	pursuant to Article IX, Section 3 of the Chuuk State
24	Constitution.
25	Section 17, Nomination and Confirmation. The
26	Governor shall appoint and nominate, with the advice and
27	consent of the Senate, principal officers, principal
28	advisors, and other officials in positions requiring such
29	advice and consent of the Senate as prescribed by statute not
30	later than 45 days after:
31	a) the Governor has taken the oath of office;
32	b) a vacancy has occurred in any position
33	requiring advice and consent of the Senate;
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1	c) a new position requiring advice and
2	consent of the Senate has been created; or
3	d) an appointment and nomination by the
4	Governor has been rejected by the Senate.
5	Section 18. Exercise of Power and Authority by Nominee.
6	A nominee appointed by any appointing authority, whose
7	appointment and nomination requires the advice and consent of
8	the Senate, may exercise the power and authority of the
9	department or office to which nominated until such nomination
10	has been rejected by the Senate.
11	Section 19. Temporary Head of Department and Office.
12	In the event of any vacancy resulting from the death,
13	resignation, or removal of the head of a department or
14	office, or the disability of such officer beyond 180 calendar
15	days, the Governor shall designate an acting head of the
16	department or office who shall act in such capacity until the
17	Governor's appointment and nomination has been confirmed by
18	the Senate
19	Section 20. Absence of Governor. During the temporary
20	absence of the Governor from the State Capital, the
21	Lieutenant Governor shall, in his capacity as the Lieutenant
22	Governor, act on behalf of the Governor in accordance with
23	the general or specific instruction of the Governor.
24	Pursuant to such instruction, the Lieutenant Governor, and no
25	other officer except as provided in Section 21 below, may
26	sign any document for or on behalf of the Governor.
27	Section 21. Absence of Governor and Lieutenant Governor.
28	During the temporary absence of both the Governor and
29	Lieutenant Governor from the State Capital, any of these
30	department or office directors including the Attorney
31	General, except if not wesetan Chuukese, may be appointed to
32	function in the temporary capacity of Executive Officer and
33	who shall be the vocal point of communication and

1	coordination on behalf of the Governor in accordance with
2	specific instructions of the Governor.
3	Section 22. Compensation. Heads of departments and
4	offices established by Section 2 of this Act shall receive
5	compensation as prescribed by law, provided that the Governor
6	may prescribe such compensation by executive order for heads
7	of departments and offices in the absence of law prescribing
8	such compensation. The compensation of a director may not be
9	diminished during his term of office unless there is a
10	uniform reduction of salaries of the directors.
11	Section 23. Operation of Government. In the absence of a
12	governing statute and consistent with this Act or the
13	Constitution, the Governor may provide for the operation of
14	the Executive Branch and creation of temporary commissions or
15	task forces by executive order, administrative directive or
16	regulation.
17	Section 24. Repeal. Truk State Law No. 3-25, the
18	Executive Branch Organization Act of 1980, with all
19	amendments thereto, is hereby repealed in its entirety.
20	Section 25. Severability Clause. If any provision of
21	this Act, or the application thereof, is held invalid,
22	such holding shall not affect other provisions or application
23	of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid
24	provision or application, and to this end the provisions of
25	this Act are severable.
26	Section 26. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect
27	upon approval by the Governor, or upon its becoming law
28	without such approval.
