

AN ACT

To amend Section 1 II D(1)(2), E (1)(b)(i) and E(2) of Chuuk State Law No. 2-94-23, as amended by Chuuk State Law No. 3-95-16, to redistribute and realign previously appropriated funds in the Mekecks and Northwest, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CHUUK STATE LEGISLATURE:

Section 1. Amendment. Section 1 II D(1)(2), E(1)(b)(i) and E(2) of Chuuk State Law No. 2-94-23, as amended by Chuuk State Law No. 3-95-16, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. The sum of \$11,975,787, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the State for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995 for the purpose of funding social and economic development projects in the State of Chuuk. The fund shall be apportioned as follows:




Section 2. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon approval by the Governor, or upon its becoming law without such approval.


