### Re: Act No. 10-10

Dear President Mailo and Speaker Harper:

I am respectfully transmitting the attached Act No. 10 - 10 which I have returned without my signature and has thus become law on it sown and is designated as Chuuk State Law No. 10 - 09 - 08. I returned this Act without any action on my part because the legal issues surrounding this Act are the same legal ones I had with the increase in your salaries and allowances as provided in the Budget Act for FY 2010.

In my view, the same analysis would apply. No matter how we view it (either as a clarification or explanation), this Act is an effort to authorize the increase in your salaries and allowances over and above those that the <u>Sauder</u> case held to be the lawful salary and allowance of members of the Legislature. However, because we (our Budget working group) are still discussing the resolution of these issues, I'd rather let this Act become law, of course, subject to what decisions we reached on the resolution of the legal issues concerning increases in the salaries and allowances of members of the Legislature via our working group.

As I'm sure you are now aware, the Attorney General has issued a formal legal opinion to the effect that the salary and allowance increases for members of the Legislature in the FY'10 budget act are unconstitutional. This could also impact the future implementation of this Act, should it become clear that the increases are unconstitutional by the proper tribunal. By this I am viewing the <u>Sauder</u> case as the final and ultimate arbiter of the issues before us due to these legislations. That is of course unless the Trial Division of the Chuuk State Supreme Court changes its mind on the <u>Sauder</u> ruling or a higher tribunal, such as the Appellate Division, reverse or overrule the <u>Sauder</u> decision. In any event, our implementation of the

Budget Act for FY'10 and this Act in the future will hinge on the lawful resolution of the issues on the increase in the salaries and allowances of members of the Legislature. I look forward to working with you on these and other issues to assist in our efforts to ensure that what we do will be following the legal rules and will be for the public good.

#### ACT NO: 10-10

# AN ACT

To set the salary and expense allowance of the members of the Chuuk State Legislature in line with the fractional computation of what is currently provided to the Governor of Chuuk as prescribed by statute, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Chuuk State Legislature:

Section 1. <u>Title</u>. This Act shall be known as "An Act to set Salary and Expense
 Allowance of the members of Chuuk State Legislature".

3 Section 2. Statement and Purpose. The purpose of this Act is to bring further 4 clarity to the salaries and expense allowances of all the members of the Chuuk State 5 Legislature based on what is currently provided to the Governor of Chuuk State as prescribed by statute vis-à-vis constitutional mandate. Chuuk State Constitution, Article 6 7 V, Section 8, (a) and (b) states, "(a) except as limited by this Constitution, members of 8 the Legislature shall receive annual salaries as prescribed by statute. No member may 9 receive as salary and expense allowance a total amount greater than 3/4 of the equivalent 10 to which the Governor is entitled by law; (b) The expense allowance for each member of the Legislature may not exceed 1/5 of the members' annual salary". The Governor is 11 currently entitled as prescribed by law a salary of \$36000.00 and an expense allowance of 12 \$10,000.00, a total of \$46,000.00. Thus, applying such mandate, a correct and exact 13 fractional computation for the salaries and expense allowance for the members of Chuuk 14 15 State Legislature should be had in furtherance with equality and fair play.

Section 3. <u>Entitlement</u>. For the purpose of this act, salary and expense allowance
of the members of the Chuuk State Legislature shall be as follows:

1) A salary and expense allowance of \$34,500 per year as defined by

- statute; thus,
- 2) A salary of 28,750 per year; and
- 21 3) An expense allowance of \$5,750 per year.

Section 4. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Act shall become effective upon approval by the
 Governor, or upon its becoming law without such approval.
