ACT NO. 12-23

## AN ACT

To further amend Section 6 and 7 of Chuuk State Law No. 12-13-08, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CHUUK STATE LEGISLATURE:

1 Section 1. <u>Amendment</u>. Section 6 of CSL No. 12-13-08 is hereby amended to

2 read as follows:

3	"Section 6. Powers and Duties of the Commission. The
4	Commission shall have the following powers and duties:
5	(a) To examine the present political and economic status of Chuuk
6	State, and to assess the financial benefits it derives under the amended Compact as
7	one of the four states in the federation.
8	(b) To make such studies as it may deem necessary concerning the
9	present and future political status of Chuuk State, including but not limited to,
10	complete independence from any political state, independence with free association
11	with the United States, maintain the status quo, or as a territory or state of the
12	United States.
13	(c) To conduct political education with the Chuukese people here and
14	abroad, to conduct polls or otherwise to ascertain their desires regarding their present
15	and future political status.
16	(d) To make recommendations what status is in the best interest of the
17	Chuukese people, and to produce drafts treaties, agreements and laws reflecting any
18	such status.
19	(e) To employ secretaries, legal counsel or other consultants or staff, as
20	it may requires to fulfill its responsibilities. Upon request of the Chairman of the
21	Commission, the Legislature and the Executive Branch shall make available any
22	technical assistance, as they may be able the Executive Branch shall make available
23	any technical assistance, as they may be able to provide. The selection of
24	employees or consultant shall be make on the basis or merit, skill and knowledge.

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1	(f) To acquire, hold, operate, use and maintain any interest in personal
2	or real property, and to enter into and to perform such contracts, leases or other
3	agreements or transaction as may be necessary or proper to the fulfillment of the
4	obligations of the Commission under this Act.
5	(g) To execute all instruments necessary and appropriate in the exercise
6	of any of its functions.
7	(h) To accept gifts or donation of services or of real or personal
8	property as may aid its activities in fulfilling its obligation under this Act.
9	(i) To submit periodic reports to the Legislature concerning its
10	activities pursuant to this Act, no less frequently than every three months once it
11	becomes operational and to submit a final report to the Legislature and the
12	Governor containing its final findings and recommendation no later than 29
13	months. Before the final report is submitted to the Legislature and the Governor,
14	the Commission shall conduct public hearings in public adequate opportunity to
15	comment on the proposed draft report."
16	Section 2. Amendment. Section 7 of CSL 12-13-08, as amended, is further
17	amended to read as follows:
18	"Section 7. Adoption of the Commission's Final Report and
19	<b>Dissolution of the Political Status Commission</b> .
20	(a) Upon receipt by the Legislature of the Commission's Final Report
21	containing its findings and recommendations, the Legislature shall have up to thirty
22	(30) days when in session to certify by joint resolution that the work of the
23	Commission is complete, or the Legislature shall return the final report to the
24	Commission requesting clarifications or further examinations as specified in detail
25	by the Legislature. If the Legislature fails to act within the 30 days time period,
26	the final report will be deemed certified and it shall be transmitted to the Chuuk
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	State Direction Commission pursuant to Section 7(b). The Commission shall be
28	State Election Commission pursuant to Section 7(b). The Commission shall be dissolved within 30 days after the Chuuk State Election Commission has certified
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presiding officers of the Legislature shall transmit to the Chuuk State Election
Commission the recommended political status to be submitted to the Chuukese
people for adoption in a plebiscite. At the next State's mid-term election, after this
transmittal, the Chuuk State Election Commission shall cause a plebiscite to be
conducted by placing the political status question on the ballots indicating the
names of the candidates for the State's mid-term election, and shall certify and
transmit the results of the plebiscite to the presiding officers of the Legislature.

8 (c) If more than one recommended political status is on the ballot, and if 9 no one political status received a majority of the votes cast in the plebiscite, a 10 run-off plebiscite shall be held 45 calendar days from the date upon which the result 11 of the first plebiscite was certified to the Legislature between the two status 12 recommendations which received the highest number of votes.

13 (d) Notwithstanding Section 6(i) and 7(a) of this Act, if the recommended political status received a majority of the votes cast in the plebiscite the 14 15 Commission shall, within 30 days after the results of the plebiscite have been 16 certified to the presiding officers of the legislature, continue and take any and all actions necessary to accomplish the recommended political status that the 17 Chuukese people approved in the plebisite. The Commission shall remain active 18 until the approved political status has been constitutionally established or until 19 March 31, 2016, which ever comes first. 20

(e) Upon dissolution of the Commission all members and its employees of
the shall submit all claims for reimbursement of expenses and other payments to
which they may be entitled to the Department of Administrative Services (DAS)
within five days following the dissolution of the Commission.

(f) The Political Status Commission shall conduct an inventory of all
assets and liabilities hold by the Commission within five days after its dissolution,
and such inventory shall be submitted to the Legislature and DAS, DAS shall
examine the inventory and compare it with receipts and other financial documents
from the Commission and certify true and correct inventory of assets and liabilities
believed to be in possession and control of the Commission and deliver a copy of

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such certified inventory to the Legislature and the Governor.

(g) At the time of the dissolution of the Commission, all assets held by the Commission shall become the properties of the Legislature.

(h) Failure of any member of employee of the Commission to deliver the 4 assets which are the subject of subsection (f) above within 5 days following the 5 dissolution of the Commission shall constitute a violation of this Act and shall be 6 punishable, upon conviction, by imprisonment of not less than 6 months and a fine 7 of not less than \$1,000, or both. 8

Section 3. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon approval of the

Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval 10
