
TO ESTABLISH A TRUK DISTRICT PEACE CORPS ADVISORY COUNCIL, TO SET FORTH ITS FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES, AND TO REPEAL TRUK DISTRICT LAW 13-3 RELATING TO SAME, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TRUK DISTRICT LEGISLATURE THAT:

Section 1. Established Purpose. There is hereby established a Peace Corps Advisory Council for the purpose of serving as a guide and advisor to the Peace Corps Representative in the Truk District. The Advisory Council, through the Peace Corps Representative, shall provide general guidance and advice to the Peace Corps Volunteers assigned to Truk District on any subjects which are relevant to the work of the Peace Corps Volunteers and their relationship with the Trukese people.

Section 2. Membership. There shall be six members of the Advisory Council, three appointed by the Speaker of the Truk District Legislature, one appointed by the District Administrator, and one Peace Corps Volunteer appointed by the Peace Corps Representative, and the sixth member shall be the Peace Corps Representative. Each member, except for the Peace Corps Representative whose term shall expire upon his transfer or termination from his duty post, shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing official. The Speaker of the Truk District Legislature and the District Administrator may serve as ex-officio members of the Advisory Council without the right to vote. At its first organizational meeting, the Advisory Council shall elect its officers consisting of a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Secretary, and any other officers the membership deems necessary to carry out their duties and functions effectively.

Section 3. Meetings--Quorum. The Advisory Council shall have at least one regular meeting in each calendar quarter, or more often as the Chairman may deem necessary to transact business of the Advisory Council. Four members present at a meeting shall constitute a quorum for purposes of transacting business.

Section 4. Duties--Powers. The Peace Corps Advisory Council shall have the authority to review all problems which arise concerning the works and behavior of the Peace Corps Volunteers and to make recommendations to the Peace Corps Representative and the District Administrator. The Peace Corps Advisory Council may recommend the termination and reassignment of Peace Corps Volunteers within the Truk District.

Section 3. Compensation --Members. Members of the Advisory Council shall be entitled to compensation at the rate established and funds made available by the Truk District Legislature for members of Boards and Committees when actually performing the functions of the Advisory Council, and approved by the Chairman, except that those members who are government employees shall instead receive their regular salaries while performing the functions of the Advisory Council.

S Section 6. Truk District Law 13-3 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon approval by the District Administrator or upon its becoming law without such approval.
