AN ACT

To further amend sections 503, 913 and 914 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended by Public Laws No. 18-108 and 19-21, to allow the disposal at sea of by-catch after recording the by-catch in a daily catch report form, to allow for alternate methods of the reporting and disposal of sharks, to clarify the standards for criminal and civil penalties and to allow for clarification of the penalty provision, and for other purposes." BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA: Section 503 of title 24 of the Code of the 1 Section 1. 2 Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as enacted by Public Law No. 18-108, is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 "Section 503. Disposal of by-catch by fishing vessels. 4 (1) By-catch caught by a fishing vessel, either by 5 purse seine or longline vessels, may either be landed at 6 7 a transshipment port in the Federated States of 8 Micronesia in accordance with any regulation promulgated 9 pursuant to this act or recorded in the daily catch 10 report form for the vessel and discarded. If sharks are caught alive they are to be released. 11 12 (2) It shall be unlawful for fishing vessels to retain, discard or otherwise dispose of by-catch in 13 contravention of this section. 14

(3) Any person who commits an act in violation of
this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of not
less than \$100,000 and not more than \$500,000.

1	(4) Any by-catch pursuant to this title may be					
2	disposed of in such manner as prescribed by regulation."					
3	Section 2. Section 913 of title 24 of the Code of the					
4	Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended by Public					
5	Laws Nos. 18-108 and 19-21, is hereby further amended to read as					
6	follows:					
7	"Section 913. Possession, handling and sale of fish,					
8	shark, or shark fin, unlawfully taken.					
9	(1) No person shall knowingly and intentionally capture,					
10	ship, transport, offer for sale, sell, purchase, import,					
11	export or have custody, control or possession of any fish					
12	taken or retained in contravention of this subtitle or any					
13	access agreement, permit or applicable law except as					
14	defined in this section.					
15	(2) It shall be unlawful for fishing vessels to remove					
16	shark fins from sharks on board fishing vessels, and to					
17	retain on board, transship or land sharks or shark fins,					
18	subject to subsections (4) and (6).					
19	(3) It shall be unlawful for fishing vessels to possess					
20	wire leaders, steel trace, or wire trace.					
21	(4) All sharks caught by a fishing vessel shall be					
22	either: (a) if still alive, immediately released back					
23	into the ocean. Fishing vessels must ensure that sharks					
24	are released whole, and that sharks are not					
25	unnecessarily harmed during the release process; or (b)

1 if dead, may either be landed at a transshipment port in 2 the Federated States of Micronesia, recorded in the 3 daily catch report form for the vessel and discarded. 4 Fishing vessels must ensure that sharks are landed whole 5 with all shark fins attached to the carcass. Any sharks 6 caught as by-catch should be handled in the above 7 manner.

8 (5) It shall be unlawful to purchase, offer for sale 9 or sell sharks or shark parts, including shark fins 10 which have been removed on board a vessel, transshipped 11 or landed in contravention of this section.

12 (6) Any person who holds a license or permit from the 13 Authority to conduct scientific research on sharks and 14 carries out activities in accordance with that license 15 or permit shall not be held in contravention of this 16 section.

17 (7) Any person who intentionally and knowingly
18 commits an act in violation of this section shall be
19 subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$50,000 and
20 not more than \$250,000.

(8) It shall be a rebuttable presumption that any
sharks caught or shark fins possessed by a fishing
vessel fishing in the EEZ of the Federated States of
Micronesia, originated from the EEZ of the Federated
States of Micronesia.

2	shall be destroyed by incineration."					
3	Section 3. Section 914 of title 24 of the Code of the					
4	Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended by Public					
5	5 Law No. 18-108, is hereby further amended to read as follows:					
6	6 "Section 914. Destruction of evidence					
7	(1) No person shall destroy, dispose of, conceal,					
8	tamper with or abandon any fish, shark, shark fin, fish					
9	product, fishing gear, net or other fish appliance,					
10	record, document, electric shock device, explosive,					
11	poison or other noxious substance, or any other thing					
12	with intent to avoid seizure or the detection of an					
13	offense against this subtitle, except for those actions					
14	allowed in this subtitle.					
15	(2) Any person who commits an act in violation of					
16	this section is subject to a civil penalty of not less					
17	than \$100,000 and not more than \$500,000."
