BE IT ENACTED BY THE KOSRAE STATE LEGISLATURE

1	Section 1. Pr	urpose. The purpose of this act is to reorganize certain principal			
2	departments and functions of the Executive Branch.				
3	Section 2. Amendment. Title 5, Chapter 2, at Section 5.201 and Section 5.202 of the

12	of the Kosrae State Code;			
13		(g)	monitors employment conditions in the private sector;

17	inspections of public projects; and			
18		(e)	maintains Government-owned buildings and equipment.	
19	(5)	The	Department of Resources and Economic Affairs:	
20		(a)	promotes development and improvement of private sector business	

1	and oversees foreign investment;			
2		(b)	fosters production, marketing and protection of commercial	
3	production of land and sea produce;			
4		(c)	assists private parties in the development of agriculture and forestry	
5	in an ecologically sound manner;			
6		(d)	manages, conserves and develops marine resources;	
7		(e)	administers the Kosrae Home Improvement Program Revolving	
8	Fund;			
9		(f)	develops a consumer awareness program and provides businesses	
10	with information on pricing laws and regulations;			
11		(g)	surveys all public and private lands and monitors the use of public	
12	lands maintaining a written roster of all parcels of public land;			
13		(h)	acts as Registrar of Lands; and	
14		(i)	negotiates Government leases, easements, and contracts, and	
15	designates for homesteading purposes public land in accordance with Chapter 5 of Title 11 of			
16	this Code.; and			
17		(j)	coordinates economic planning, including the Government's	
18	Adherence to the or	verall	Economic Development Plan.	
19	(6)	The	Office of the Attorney General	
20		(a)	enforces State penal laws, delegating enforcement to a department in	

1	its discretion;			
2	(b) oversees Government compliance with law;			
3	(c) provides legal advice and representation to the Executive, including			
4	the collection of outstanding reimbursements and revenues;			
5	(d) provides legal advice and representation to other components of			
6	Government when directed by the Governor; and			
7	(e) regulates the use of roads by motor vehicles.			
8	Section 3. Effective Date. This act takes effect upon the approval of the Governor or			
9	upon its becoming law without such approval.
