#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

Establishing the Fourth Kosrae State Constitution Convention; and for other purposes.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE KOSRAE STATE LEGISLATURE

1 Section 1. Constitutional Convention. The Fourth Kosrae State Constitution Convention, 2 hereinafter referred to as "the Convention," is hereby established, for the purpose of proposing 3 amendments to the Constitution of Kosrae State, pursuant to Article XV of the Constitution and 4 the referendum approved by the voters at the special election held on Wednesday, July 1, 2015. 5 Section 2. Session of the Convention. The Convention shall convene at 10:00 a.m. on a date to be set by the Governor, and shall continue in session for no longer than 20 working days. Said 6 session may be extended by five working days by a vote of the delegates. The Convention may 7 8 recess during the period of session. 9 Section 3. Delegates to the Convention. The Convention shall consist of 14 delegates 10 representing the four municipalities of Kosrae who shall be elected at a special election on a date 11 to be set by the Governor. The delegates shall come from the municipalities as follows: 12 (a) Lelu 5 members 13 (b) Tafunsak 4 members 14 (c) Malem 3 members 15 (d) Utwe 2 members

1	Section 4. <u>Elections</u> . The delegates to be elected under Section 3 of this act shall be
2	elected as follows:
3	(a) Conduct of the election, including voter registration and qualifications, shall
4	be pursuant to Title 3 of the Kosrae State Code except to the extent
5	inconsistent with this act.
6	(b) Any FSM citizen who is 25 years of age or older, is a qualified voter in a
7	municipality listed on the register for that municipality at the time of
8	determination of his qualification as a delegate, and is not currently under a
9	judgment of mental incompetency or insanity, or was convicted as a felon by
10	any court, shall be eligible for election as a delegate from that municipality.
11	The payment of a non-refundable twenty five dollar (\$25.00) fee shall be
12	required for a candidate's name to be placed on the ballot or, in the case of a
13	write-in candidate, for votes he has received to be treated as valid as provided
14	for under Section 3.1509 of the Kosrae State Code.
15	(c) Each person voting for delegates shall be permitted to vote for the number of
16	delegates to which the municipality in which that person votes is entitled. The
17	candidates not elected shall be designated as alternates in the order of their
18	vote totals.
19	(d) In the case of a tie vote for a delegate slot, the candidates who received the
20	same number of votes for that slot shall draw lots under the supervision of the

1	Election Commissioner to determine who shall serve as a delegate.
2	(e) The Convention shall be on the sole judge of the election returns and
3	qualifications of delegates.
4	Section 5. <u>Vacancies</u> .
5	(a) As used in this Section, the term "vacancy" includes a vacancy due to
6	(1) Death;
7	(2) Resignation; or
8	(3) Incapacity to serve as a delegate by reason of illness, non-
9	qualification or a loss of eligibility under Section 4(b) of this act upon
10	a finding of the same by a majority of the delegates to the Convention.
11	(b) A delegate vacancy shall be filled by the candidate receiving the next
12	highest number of votes in the election of delegates from the same
13	municipality. In the event that there is no alternate delegate, the Governor
14	shall fill the vacancy by appointing a person who qualifies under Section
15	4(b) of this act to represent the municipality.
16	Section 6. Pre-Convention Committee; Cooperation from Government.
17	(a) There shall be a Pre-Convention Committee which shall consist of the
18	two delegates from each of the four municipalities who received the
19	highest number of votes in their municipalities, provided that, where there
20	is a tie vote, the older of the delegates involved in the tie shall serve on the

1	Pre-Convention Committee. The delegate receiving the Committee shall
2	meet for a maximum of 10 working days prior to the Convention. At the
3	meetings, the Committee shall:
4	(1) Choose its own officers and organize according to its
5	own rules and procedures;
6	(2) Make arrangements for accommodations, equipment
7	and facilities;
8	PROVIDED, however, that the Pre-Convention Committee shall
9	whenever possible arrange to utilize State Government equipment
10	and facilities;
11	(3) Ensure that all staffing needs of the Convention will be
12	met;
13	(4) Prepare a budget for the Convention to be submitted to
14	the Legislature;
15	(5) In its discretion, prepare the delegates for their
16	Convention duties through meetings, materials, poll or
17	otherwise;
18	(6) Confer with the various municipal delegations to
19	identify those issues that each delegation wishes to raise
20	at the convention:

1	(7) Commission any research that it feels should be
2	performed on issues identified by the municipal
3	delegations prior to the convening of the Convention;
4	(8) Examine and report to the Convention on the
5	qualifications of the delegates;
6	(9) Prepare proposed rules and procedures;
7	(10) Take such reasonable and appropriate actions as
8	may be necessary to accomplish the above duties for
9	the benefit of the Convention.
10	(b) The Committee Chairman, with the approval of the Pre-Convention
11	Committee, and the presiding officer, with the approval of the Convention,
12	may enter into agreements or understandings with State and National
13	Government officials, or officials-elect, and with private individuals, for
14	the staffing and material needs of the Convention. State Government
15	officials and employees shall make every effort compatible with their
16	government duties to assist the work of the Convention and the Pre-
17	Convention Committee.
18	Section 7. Organization Rules.
19	(a) The Convention shall convene at a location selected by the Pre-Convention
20	Committee.

1	(b) The Chairman of the Pre-Convention Committee, or in his absence the Vice
2	Chairman, shall preside at the Convention until the Convention shall elect a
3	permanent presiding officer.
4	(c) The Convention shall select from among its membership a presiding officer
5	and such other officers as it may deem necessary and appropriate.
6	(d) The Convention shall establish such committees as it may deem necessary and
7	appropriate to carry out its duties.
8	(e) The Convention shall adopt its own rules of procedure not inconsistent with
9	this act. The rules shall provide the form of proposed amendments, which in
10	any case shall be numbered and each given a descriptive title and effective
11	date.
12	Section 8. Immunity. No delegate may be held to answer before any other tribunal for
13	any speech or debate in the Convention. Delegates are, in all cases except felony for
14	breach of the peace, privileged from arrest during their attendance at sessions or
15	committee meetings for the Convention, and in going to and returning from the same.
16	Section 9. <u>Investigative Powers</u> . The Convention may exercise, according to procedures
17	established by it, all the authority and attributes inherent in legislative bodies, including,
18	but not limited to, the power to institute and conduct investigations, issue subpoenas to
19	witnesses and other interested parties, and administer oaths.
20	Section 10. Administrative Leave. Officials and employees of the State Government

	who are delegates, staff, witnesses or advisors to the Convention shall receive
	administrative leave with pay to perform their respective functions at the Convention.
	Section 11. Compensation of Delegates. A Convention delegate who is not a Kosrae
	State Government employee shall receive compensation from funds appropriated for that
	purpose at a rate of \$25.00 for each day on which the delegate performs an authorized
	activity of the Convention or the Pre-Convention Committee, PROVIDED, that there
	shall be deducted from each day's payment any amount which the delegate received for
	that day, either for actual performance of his governmental or other employment duties or
	by way of leave the calculation of a deduction pursuant to this Section, a governmental
	salary based on a yearly, bi-weekly, or other rate shall be prorated to a daily rate.
	Section 12. Public Information and Discussion. The Office of the Governor shall be
	responsible for a thorough, balanced program of information and discussion on the
	Convention and the proposed Constitutional amendments from the time the Convention
	convenes until the date of the referendum on the proposed Constitutional amendments.
	The Office of the Governor shall take all reasonable steps to have the program reach
	persons who are qualified to vote in the referendum and reside outside Kosrae State.
	Section 13. Proposed Constitutional Amendments; Adjournment Sine Die; Record and
	Property. The proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be expressed by the
	Convention in the Kosraean and English languages in the form finally adopted by the
	Convention. Upon adoption of the proposed amendments to the Constitution, the

	Convention shall transmit each in certified form to the Governor who shall be responsible
	for its publication. Upon vote of a majority of the delegates, or upon expiration the term
	of the Convention, whichever comes first, the Convention shall adjourn sine die and
	expire, and thereupon all materials, equipment, unused supplies or other property
	purchased with funds appropriated by this act shall be accounted for by the allottee(s) of
	the funds to the Speaker of the Legislature and shall immediately be transferred to the
	Legislature for its use or disposition according to law; PROVIDED, that all files,
	documents, and video, oral and printed records of the Convention shall be accounted for
	by the permanent presiding officer of the Convention to the Governor and shall be given
	into the possession of the Governor as State Government property for preservation by
	him and for access to the public upon reasonable conditions to be made by him.
	Section 14. Referendum.
	(a) The Governor by proclamation shall set a date for the referendum on the proposed
	amendments to the Constitution. If a date specific is given as the effective date for
	one or more of the amendments adopted by the Convention, the referendum shall be
	held no later than the earliest of any such dates specific. In any event, the referendum
	shall be held within 90 days of the adjournment sine die of the Convention.
	(b) To the extent consistent with this act, the referendum shall be conducted in
	accordance with the provisions of Title 3 of the Kosrae State Code.
	(c) The Election Commissioner shall cause a referendum ballot to be prepared in

1	Kosraean and English, which for each proposed amendment adopted by the
2	Convention shall set forth the title of the proposed amendment and the text of the
3	amendment, along with the effective date, followed immediately by the question:
4	"Do you approve this proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of
5	Kosrae adopted by the Fourth Kosrae State Constitutional Convention?
6	[] Yes [] No"
7	(d) A proposed amendment takes effect as provided by Article XV, Section 2 of the
8	Constitution.
9	(e) The Election Commissioner certifies and announces the results of the election with
10	respect to each proposed amendments upon determining that the conduct of the
11	election was lawful.
12	(f) In the event conflicting constitutional amendments submitted to the voters at the same
13	election are approved, the amendment receiving the highest number of affirmative
14	votes shall prevail to the extent of the conflict.
15	Section 15. Effective Date. This act takes effect upon its approval by the Governor or
16	upon its becoming law without such approval.
