PUBLIC LAW NO. 21-104

AN ACT

To further amend chapter 6 of title 55 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended, by adding a new section 609A, for the purpose of establishing a temporary tourism sector mitigation relief fund to alleviate some of the economic loss felt by the tourism industry and individuals working in the tourism industry who were laid off during the coronavirus epidemic, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Chapter 6 of title 55 of the Code of the
- 2 Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended, is
- 3 hereby further amended by adding a new section 609A, to read as
- 4 follows:
- 5 "Section 609A. Tourism Sector Mitigation Fund.
- 6 (1) There is created a Tourism Sector Mitigation Fund
- 7 to be used to partially offset the economic losses of
- 8 the businesses in the tourism industry and individuals
- 9 working in the tourism industry who were laid off in the
- 10 Federated States of Micronesia during the coronavirus
- 11 epidemic.
- 12 (2) Moneys for the Tourism Sector Mitigation Fund
- 13 shall be derived from appropriations by the Congress of
- 14 the Federated States of Micronesia and the State
- 15 legislatures, United States grants, funds designated for
- 16 such purposes from international organizations and from
- any and all other appropriate sources.

(3) Tourism sector businesses operating in the
Federated States of Micronesia seeking relief from the
Tourism Sector Mitigation Fund must show tax returns
from the previous year in order to establish their
losses claimed under this fund. Individuals in the
tourism sector, who are seeking compensation for lost
wages due to being laid off as a result of the economic
downturn, must submit their last paycheck stub and a
statement from their employer in the tourism industry,
who laid them off, evidencing their unemployment. The
President shall issue regulations for equitable
compensation for affected businesses, including a
possible cap on the amount of a valid claim.
(4) The distributions from the funds shall be managed
and administered by a committee named by the President
comprising representatives of the Departments of
Resources and Development; Finance; Justice; and
Environment, Climate Change and Emergency Management.
The committee shall report quarterly to Congress on the
status of the fund and distributions therefrom.

(5) For the purposes of this fund tourism sector businesses shall include hotel operators, car rentals, tour operators, resorts, dive shops, airlines or any other tourist specific business not mentioned above.

1	(6) The Tourism Sector Mitigation Fund shall expire
2	at the end of fiscal year 2021. Any unexpended funds
3	shall lapse into the Disaster Relief Fund."
4	Section 2. This act shall become law upon approval
5	by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or
6	upon its becoming law without such approval.
